Sande y'Obushatu Oburikwera 31.05.2026 A

Okuruga 34: 4b-6,8-9; 2 Abakorinto 13:11-13; Yohaana 3:16-18



**B**anyaruganda, mutabaarukye ekiro kikuru

ky'Obushatu Oburikwera! "Bushatu burikwera wenka haisibwa, Bushatu bw'obumwe butoosha haisibwa." Erizooba nitweijusya eibanga rikuru rya Ruhanga Omwe, omubetwara bashatu: Ruhanga Taata, Ruhanga Mwana, na Ruhanga Mutima Orikwera. N'ekintu ekiine eryetegyereza oku emwe, wagaitaho emwe, okongyeraho emwe, erikuguma eri emwe (1+1+1=1). Omuhikiriire Agustino ku yabaire nayecumintiriza ah'eibanga eri, yaroota ngu akaana kato kakaba nikagyezaho kutaha amaizi g'omunyanja ngu kagamarire omu kaina k'omushenyi, ekintu ekyabaire kitarikubaasika. Kuyasiimukire yayetegyereza ngu nawe tarikubaasa kwetegyereza oku abetwara/abaperesona bashatu barikubaasa kuba Ruhanga omwe (Eibanga ry'obumwe bw'abetwara bashatu omuri Ruhanga omwe).

Eibanga rya Trinita nirikuru kandi nituryatura burizooba. Nitutandika eshaara n'akamanyiso k'omusharaba turikweta Ruhanga Taata, Ruhanga Mwana, na Ruhanga Mutima Orikwera. Omweshongozi rurangaanwa Mubangizi akahimba ekyeshongoro ngu "turamye Ruhanga omwe, omubetwara bashatu: Omuzaire n'omutabani, n'enduga mubombi Mutima." Ruhanga Patri nuwe yahangire ensi n'ebigirimu byona. Ngu "ensi yona kandi n'eiguru n'ebibumbe by'omukono gwe."

Ruhanga Mwana, Yesu Kristo, n'omwana wa Ruhanga kandi Ruhanga, owahaireyo amagara gye okutucungura. Ngu "akatweha, yaaturokora, kandi na butoosha tumurya."

Ruhanga Mutima Orikwera niwe maani ga Ruhanga kandi Ruhanga, obaasisa ebintu birungi byona kubaho. Niwe atweza, akatwegyesa, akatuhabura, akatwijusya ebya Ruhanga. Ngu "twesigye Nyamuhumuza, tumuhamemo n'omutungisa, ku aturinda n'obutashobya."

Omukutandika, Ruhanga Patri, na Mwana, na Mutima Orikwera bakakwatanisa omukuhanga ensi: "katukore omuntu omu nshusha yaitu, ashushane naitwe..." (Okutandika 1:26). Omuhandiiki w'evangiri Yohaana natugira ngu "Omukutandika Kigambo akaba ariho; Kigambo akaba ari hamwe na Ruhanga, kandi Kigambo akaba ari Ruhanga. Ebintu byona niwe yabireteire kubaho; kandi ahatari we, tihariho kintu na kimwe

ekyahangirwe" (Yohana 1:1-3).

Mukama waitu Yesu Kristo nayenda ngu tube bamwe kandi ajurira obumwe bwe na Ruhanga Patri na Mutima Orikwera ati "Taata Orikwera... babe bamwe nkaitwe..." (Yohana 17:11). Kristo akagaruka yaragiira entumwa ze kuza omumahanga goona bakabatiza abaikiriza omw'eiziina rya Patri, n'erya Mwana, n'erya Mutima Orikwera. Kristo nahamya obumwe bw'abetwara bashatu arikugira ngu we na Ruhanga Taata ni bamwe; ngu kandi weena omureeba, biri aba areebire Ruhanga Taata. Kandi Kristo atakatem bire omw'iguru akaragaanisa abaikiriza ngu taribareka fuuzi; ngu aryaguma nabo kandi aryaboherereza Mutima omuhwezi.

Beene Taata, turekye kutaanisamu Ruhanga. Turamye Ruhanga omwe omubetwara bashatu. Ekiro eki nikitwijusya obumwe bwa Ruhanga, kandi kituhaya kugira obumwe na bagyenzi baitu. Obumwe bwawe na Ruhanga nibwijurira kimwe waba ori hamwe na bataahi bawe.

Katushabe Mukama, ayongyere kutwombekamu omutima gw'obumwe n'okukundana!

I have chosen the opening words of today's Gospel to thank and congratulate you—not just for being believers, but for going the extra mile to gather and unite in this wonderful AMDA forum. On Holy Thursday, Jesus prayed for unity among His followers: **“That they may be one...” - John 17:21**

Unity is life; division is death. AMDA is indeed a fulfillment of Jesus' vision and prayer. Whoever pioneered this dream was inspired by God. Otherwise, all of you would be drowning in the ocean of Kampala city, with your unique gifts buried there!

Thank you for giving us the

opportunity to share in your joy and unity today. It is from that great joy that I write these words about Uganda Martyrs Town Parish, Mbarara.

Uganda Martyrs Parish was first known as Our Lady of Fatima from 1964, when the White Fathers began founding a Catholic community there under Nyamitanga. When the Uganda Martyrs were canonized in Rome in 1964, Bishop Jean Marie Ogez of Mbarara changed the name to Uganda Martyrs Parish two years later, in 1966. It was managed by the White Fathers and erected as a parish in 1966. So our parish is exactly 60 years this year!

Over the years, our parish has grown significantly. We now have 23 Hiikas, including 8 centers. The seed of faith continues to bear fruit. By God's grace, we have been buying land and establishing new churches for the growing number of Christians in our city. We make an effort to celebrate Mass for all centers and most Hiikas every Sunday. On average, 27 Masses are celebrated every Sunday, and 6 Masses at the Parish alone!

During weekdays, we celebrate 3 Masses from Monday to Friday, except Thursday when we have two, because of a full-day adoration ending with Mass at 5:15 PM. Saturdays are for weddings, as we have many.

#### **Our parish life includes:**

1. Many Masses on Sundays and weekdays
  2. Tuesday prayer day with counseling, Penance, strong catechism, and Healing Masses
  3. Massive participation in the Way of the Cross on Good Friday
  4. Holy Uganda Martyrs Day on 3rd June and Parish Day celebrations
  5. Children's Sunday School on Sundays
- Monthly overnight prayer

on the last Friday of the month  
6. End-of-year overnight prayers at Boma grounds  
All these have empowered and increased the Christian community in Mbarara City! Please, when you're in Mbarara, join us for Christian nourishment in any of the above programs.

We also have very strong lay apostolate movements, especially the Legion of Mary, Yuda Taddeo, MCWA, Xaverians, and Crusaders of the Holy Eucharist.

All these are managed by a strong Pastoral/Parish Council headed by Mr. Charles Byonanebye, as well as committed catechists headed by Mr. Tadeo Mwangyera, who is now Head Catechist for our Archdiocese.

We are 5 priests: Fr. Vincent Ahimbisibwe, Fr. Agaba Francis Kadiidi, Fr. David Tibingana, Fr. Agabito Arinaitwe, and myself, Fr. Didas R. Kasapuri. We also live with Deacon Derrick from Ibanda. Visiting priests also come in to support us.

We are now planning to begin construction of a new, unique parish church. The project is estimated to cost UGX 28 billion and will have a seating capacity of over 3,000 people. Once realized, we hope it will stand as a signature project for our Archdiocese. Please pray for us and support us. Mbarara is a city for all of us!

I wish to re-echo the words of St. Paul to the Philippians :

**“I thank my God every time I remember you. In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy, because of your partnership in the gospel”- \_Phil. 1:2-3**

People of AMDA, you bring joy to our Archdiocese. You have fed the hungry, visited prisoners and refugees, and proclaimed the Good News to the poor and rich alike through pastoral activities like the Caravans, supporting young men and women in religious and priestly vocations, and attending our diocesan functions, to mention but a few.

I thank the AMDA Chaplain, Fr. Darius Magunda, and his assistants, your Ex-Com, and all of you, the people of God, for this great work.

Finally, like the late His Grace Paul Bakyenga, I pray: **“Stay with us, Lord”**. We pray that the Lord may remain with us as we continue to do His will.

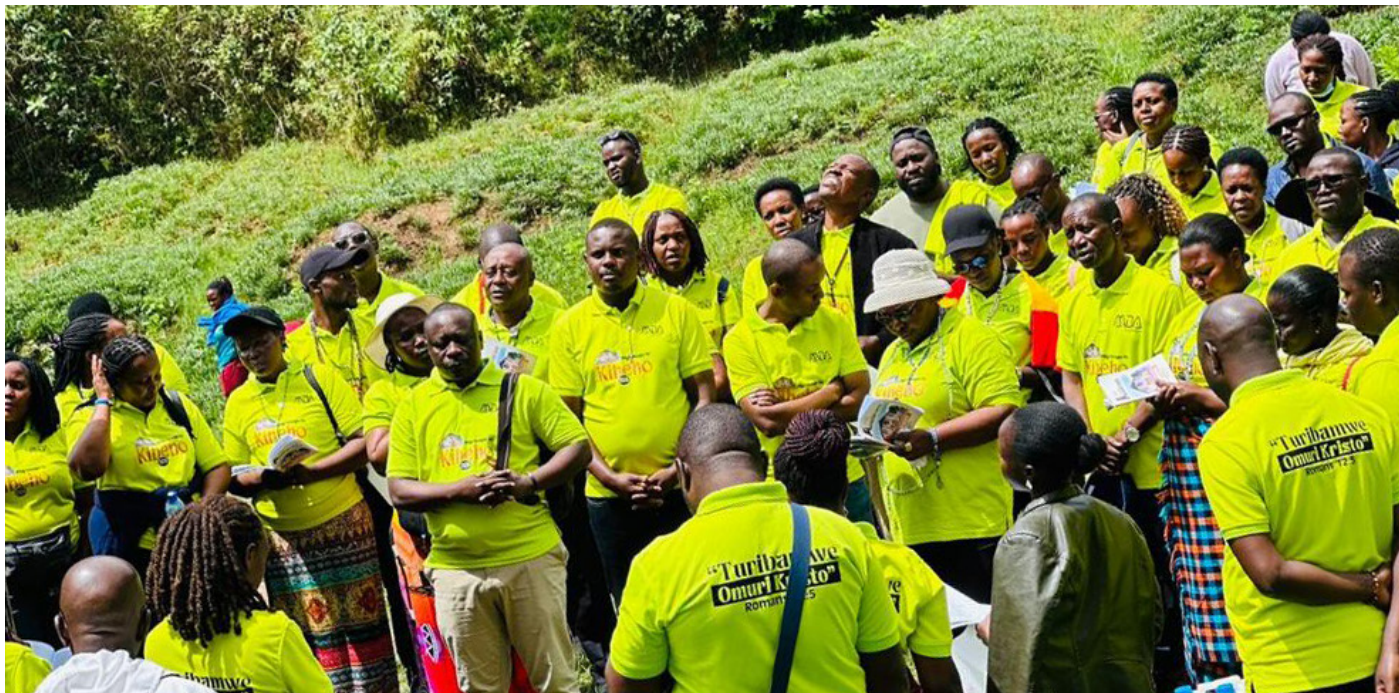

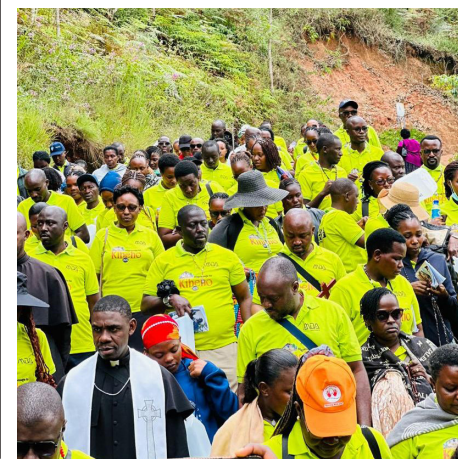

# Introduction & Background of AMDA SACCO

**T**he Archdiocese of Mbarara Development Association, Savings and Credit Co-operatives Limited, (AMDA SACCO) was started in 2011 as a financial institution for the members of AMDA residing in Kampala and surroundings areas, with the overall objective of Members' economic empowerment. Since it opened its doors to all willing members in 2011, AMDA SACCO has been at the forefront of mobilising (and growing) savings and extending credit and other financial services to its members. AMDA SACCO is legally registered under the Cooperative Societies Act, (as amended in 2020) and licensed under the Tier 4 Microfinance and Money Lenders Act (as amended in 2020) and subscribes to the relevant regulatory authorities. Job/Services: Outsourced Internal Audit function

To strengthen internal controls, mitigate risks and enhance operational efficiency, the SACCO seeks to engage a licensed audit firm or Individual to carry out the role of Internal Auditor (IA) on a contractual basis.

The Internal Auditor will provide independent and objective assurance and consulting services designed to add value and improve the SACCO's operations. These Terms of Reference (TOR) outline the expectations, scope, roles, responsibilities and other key aspects of the engagement.

## Objectives

The primary objectives of engaging the Internal Auditor are:

To evaluate and improve the

effectiveness of the SACCO's risk management, control and governance processes.

To ensure compliance with applicable laws, regulations, policies and procedures.

To identify areas of potential improvement in a bid to improve operational efficiency and financial reporting.

To provide assurance to the Board and Management on the integrity of financial and operational information.

To conduct spot checks and internal audits to detect and prevent fraud, errors and inefficiencies.

## Scope of Work

The scope of the Internal Auditor's services shall cover all aspects of the SACCO's operations, including but not limited to:

**Financial audits:** Reviewing financial statements, accounting records and transactions for accuracy, completeness and compliance.

**Operational audits:** Assessing internal processes, such as loan disbursement, member savings management, cash handling and procurement.

**Compliance audits:** Ensuring adherence to the Cooperative Societies Act, relevant regulatory guidelines like UMRA and internal policies.

**Risk-based audits:** Identifying and evaluating key risks in areas like credit risk, liquidity risk, operational risk and information technology risk.

**Spot checks:** Conducting unannounced inspections of records and processes to verify compliance and detect

irregularities.

**Special investigations:** Undertaking ad-hoc reviews as requested by the Board or management, such as fraud investigations or reviews of specific concerns.

**Advisory services:** Providing recommendations on improving internal controls, governance and efficiency without assuming management responsibilities.

The audits shall encompass all departments and activities of the SACCO. The Internal Auditor shall perform services at least once every three months, with additional visits as deemed necessary based on risk assessments or specific requests.

## Roles and Responsibilities

The Internal Auditor shall:

- Develop and implement an annual risk-based internal audit plan in consultation with the Finance and Administration Committee of the Board.
- Conduct audits in accordance with international auditing standards for the professional practice of internal auditing (e.g., those issued by the Institute of Internal Auditors).
- Perform spot checks on critical areas such as cash counts, loan portfolios, and member accounts.
- Evaluate the adequacy and effectiveness of internal controls and recommend enhancements.
- Review the reliability and integrity of financial and operational information.
- Assess compliance with laws, regulations, and internal policies.
- Identify opportunities for cost savings, process

improvements, and risk mitigation.

- Prepare detailed audit reports with findings, risks, implications, and actionable recommendations.
- Follow up on the implementation of previous audit recommendations and report on progress.
- Maintain independence and objectivity in all audit activities.
- Ensure all work is documented thoroughly and in compliance with professional standards.
- Liaise with external auditors, regulators, and other stakeholders as required, while maintaining confidentiality.
- The Internal Auditor shall not:
- Perform management functions or make operational decisions.
- Audit areas where they have a conflict of interest.
- Engage in activities that could impair their independence.

### Reporting Structure

The Internal Auditor shall report directly to the Finance and Investment Committee of the Board to ensure independence from management. Key reporting requirements include:

- Submission of quarterly audit reports within 15 days after each audit visit.
- Immediate reporting of significant findings, such as fraud or material weaknesses, to the Committee Chair.
- Presentation of audit findings and recommendations at Committee meetings as requested.
- Annual summary report on the overall internal audit activities, key risks, and trends.
- All reports shall be clear, concise, and include:
- Executive summary.
- Detailed findings with evidence.
- Risk ratings (e.g., high, medium, low).
- Management responses to

recommendations.

Timelines for implementation.

### Qualifications and Experience

The Internal Auditor must possess:

A licensed audit firm or individual with requisite credentials as below

- A bachelor's degree in accounting, Finance, or a related field.
- Professional certifications such as Certified Internal Auditor (CIA), Certified Public Accountant (CPA), or equivalent.
- At least 3 years of experience in internal auditing, preferably in the financial services sector or cooperatives.
- Knowledge of SACCO operations, regulatory requirements and risk management frameworks.
- Strong analytical, communication, and report-writing skills.
- Proficiency in audit software and tools (e.g., ACL, IDEA).
- Demonstrated integrity, independence, and ethical standards.

### Duration and Frequency of Engagement

The engagement shall be for an initial period of 2 years, renewable based on performance.

The Internal Auditor shall conduct on-site visits at least once every month

Additional visits may be required for special audits or follow-ups.

### Deliverables

- Key deliverables include:
- Annual internal audit plan.
- Quarterly audit reports.
- Spot check reports.
- Follow-up reports on recommendation implementation.
- Any ad-hoc reports as requested.
- Internal audit charter and policy.

All deliverables shall be submitted in electronic and hard

copy formats as required.

Confidentiality and Data Protection

The Internal Auditor shall:

Treat all information obtained during the engagement as confidential.

Comply with data protection laws (e.g. Data Protection Act) and the SACCO's confidentiality policies.

Not disclose any information without prior written approval from the SACCO.

Return or destroy all documents upon completion of the engagement.

Conflict of Interest

The Internal Auditor must declare any potential conflicts of interest prior to engagement and during the term. Any undeclared conflicts may lead to immediate termination.

### Payment Terms

Fees shall be based on a fixed quarterly retainer.

Payments will be made upon submission and approval of audit reports.

All payments are subject to applicable taxes and withholdings.

### Performance Evaluation and Termination

Performance will be evaluated annually by the Finance and Administration Committee based on timeliness, quality of work, and value addition.

The engagement may be terminated by either party with 30 days' notice, or immediately in cases of breach, conflict, or unsatisfactory performance.

Upon termination, the Internal Auditor shall hand over all work papers and reports.

### Governing Law and Dispute Resolution

This TOR shall be governed by the laws of the Government of Uganda. Any disputes arising shall be resolved through mediation or arbitration before resorting to litigation.

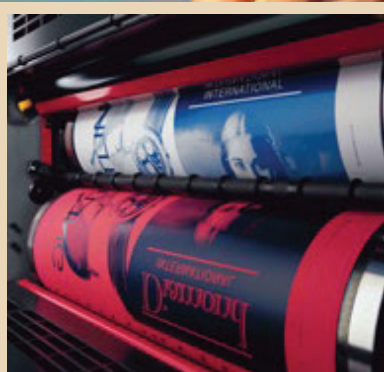
